THE KEY OF Em


Hello and welcome back, today were going to look at G's relative minor, which is of course, Em. We now know that the chords are going to be the same as G, but mainly using the minors. So the 1st ,4th And 5th chords here are Em/ Am / Bm so will sound great together, and with the addition of some of the other chords, G definitely and of course the F#dim. Now in this music theory thing, in the key of G the F#dim was the 7th chord and so was sharpened and played as a diminished chord as was the Bdim in the key of C. its always written as a diminished chord but is often played as a minor or a 7th chord. Its really up to you.



Also if you look below at the Em barre shape this can be moved up the neck to the Am position on the 5th fret, and the Bm position on the 7th fret


