You should practice these with a metronome or backing shuffle drum beat found on You Tube. My tempo was 80BPM to start you slow. You are welcome to speed it up ones you are confidante and playing smooth enough to do that.

BPM stands for beats per minute. That means speed of playing or the playing tempo.

You should always practice with a metronome so that your timing will always be spot on. That way you can jam with pro players and impress the m with your good timing.
