

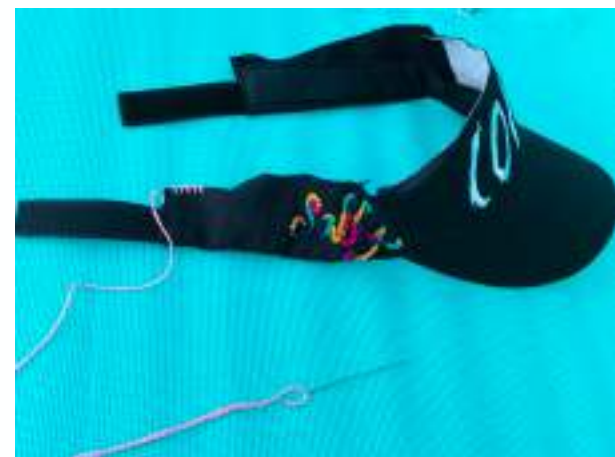
# Custom Headwear:

## How To Make a Ball Cap into a Visor

You can use a cap with or without a snap or strap back. If without, just be sure to leave the band intact all the way around.

**1:** Decide how high you want the front, and mark with chalk or a pencil or a line of running stitch.

I previously monogrammed this Core Arts cap using chainstitch and rainbow embroidery thread. There is a chainstitch worksheet available



**2:** If it helps, open the snapback if your cap has one, and lay as flat as possible.

Mark the sides of your hat where you want to cut.

Leave a bit of seam allowance that you will fold over if you want to stitch it. This will help keep the edge shape but is not essential.

**3:** Cut out your visor with a pair of sharp scissors. If seams start unravelling, you can stitch them closed.



**4:** Fold over the raw edge and stitch. This is blanket stitch which you can find on a previous worksheet. If you don't yet have this, let your member manager know and they will be able to help you.

**5:** Decorate and elaborate as much as you like! The most important thing is to have fun and experiment.

**6:** We would love to see photos of your work! If you would like to send in pictures, do ask your member manager for the Core Fashion Showcase worksheet, as it has lots of references to inspire you.

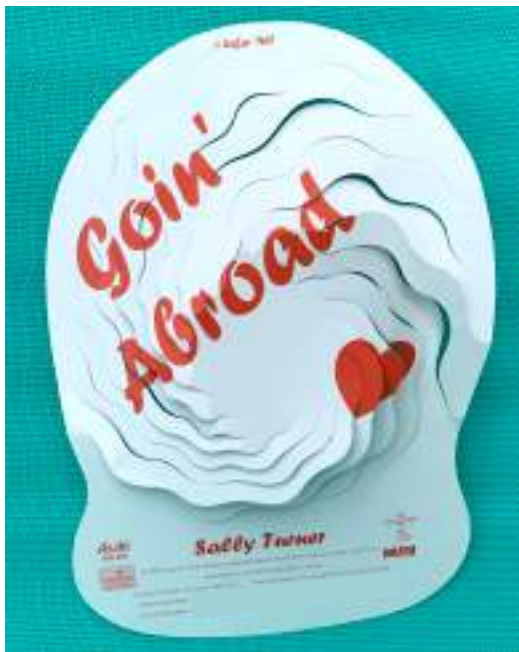

# Custom Headwear: How To Make a Leather Visor

Alternative materials could be used instead of leather. It can be a good idea to experiment with a mock-up in card first anyway, then you can use this as a pattern to draw around. If you have an existing hat you could draw round the peak for the shape



**1:** cut out a peak and a band as shown



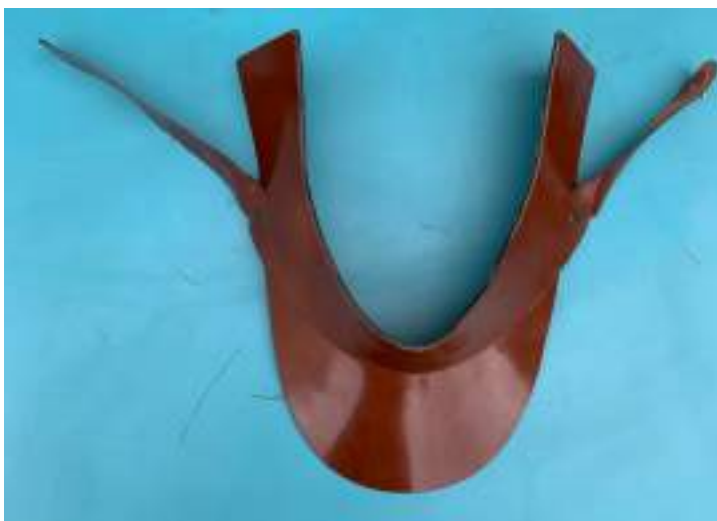
**2:** Punch holes for the thong



**3:** stitch the visor to the band in a cross as shown, and thread ties through the holes on the band

# Custom Headwear: A flat-Pack-Snap-Back-Cap

This hat is cut out of leather, the reference is the shape of a promotional paper hat. You could make this in any kind of paper or card or vinyl or leather. Shown here with press-snaps to close, but you could use various alternatives such as velcro.
